

Number of cases




Number of cases falling but still higher than last summer when they were at their lowest

Rate of cases in people aged over 60 yrs




Rate of new cases in people over the age of 60 is still high, risk of severe COVID illness and death increases with age

Patients in Hospital Daily




Still have a higher numbers of people admitted into Kingston, ChelWest (including West Middx) compared to last Spring


Where we are delivering the vaccine

Large Vaccination Centres




High volumes, high throughput in a fixed location for an extended period e.g. Harlequins in Twickenham

Local Vaccination Services



Primary care-led sites

- Care Home Residents

- Frontline Health and social care staff

- Clinically extremely vulnerable

- People aged 16-64 with an underlying health condition

- People aged 60-64

- People aged 55-59

- People aged 50-54

Prime Minister's pledge

Groups 1 to 4 to be offered the vaccine by Monday 15 February 2021

All care home staff and residents to be offered the vaccine by Sunday 24 January 2021

All front line health and care workers to be offered by end of January 2021

This is the first wave of priority groups set out by the JCVI – after all over 50s have been offered the vaccine, the programme will be extended to the under 50s.

The JCVI will lay out the next priority groups in the coming weeks. Covid vaccines are not licensed for minors.
